Holy Father's Intention for May 2024

For the Formation of Religious, Monks, Nuns, and Seminarians. The Pontiff urges prayers "so that religious, monks, nuns, and seminarians may grow in their vocational journey through human, pastoral, spiritual, and communal formation, leading them to be credible witnesses of the Gospel."

Sunday of All Saints

The first Sunday after the Feast of Pentecost is observed by the Eastern Rite Churches as the Sunday of All Saints. This day has been designated as a commemoration of all of the Saints, all the Righteous, Prophets, Apostles, Martyrs, Confessors, Shepherds, Teachers, and Holy Monastics, both men and women alike, known and unknown, who have been added to the choirs of the Saints and shall be added, from the time of Adam until the end of the world, who have been perfected in piety and have glorified God by their holy lives.

Honouring the friends of God with much reverence, the Prophet King David says, "But to me, exceedingly honourable are Your friends, O Lord" (Ps. 138:16). The Apostle Paul, recounting the achievements of the Saints, and setting forth their memorial as an example that we might turn away from earthly things and from sin, and emulate their patience and courage in the struggles for virtue, says, "Wherefore, seeing we also are surrounded with such a great cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every burden, and the sin which so easily besets us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us" (Heb. 12:1).

Guided by the teaching of the Divine Scriptures and Apostolic Tradition, we honour all the Saints, the friends of God, for they are keepers of God's commandments, shining examples of virtue, and benefactors of mankind. We honour the known Saints especially on their own day of the year, as is evident in the Church calendar.

But since many Saints are unknown, and their number has increased with time, and will continue to increase until the end of time, the Church has appointed that once a year a common commemoration be made of all the Saints. This is the feast that we celebrate today. It is the harvest of the coming of the Holy Spirit into the world; it is the "much fruit" brought forth by that "grain of wheat that fell into the earth and died" (John 12:24); it is the glorification of the Saints as "the foundation of the Church, the perfection of the Gospel, they who fulfilled in deed the sayings of the Saviour" (Vespers, Sunday of All Saints).

Canadian Speaking Tour of Ukrainian Nobel Peace Prize Winner

Ms. Oleksandra Matviichuk will be in Canada June 3-9, 2024, on a tour organized and funded by the Canada-Ukraine Foundation.

Ms. Matviichuk is the head of the Center for Civil Liberties (Ukraine). She has been working very closely with the International Criminal Court in The Hague - along with numerous European national governments - in cataloguing Russian war crimes and human rights abuses in Ukraine during the present barbaric war of aggression. Herself a human rights lawyer, she was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 2022 on behalf of the Center for their work. She has also been decorated by numerous other international governments and entities, including the OSCE Parliamentary Assembly, United States government, PEN International, and others. Ms. Matviichuk's tour will be partly a message tour, drawing attention to human rights abuses and war crimes occurring daily in Ukraine. It is also a fundraising tour to support the civil society work of the Canada-Ukraine Foundation which supports humanitarian projects, ranging from food and shelter for displaced Ukrainians, surgical missions, mobile ambulances, demining, and many other critical needs in Ukraine.
