
A Mosaic Chronicle

A Tale of Time and Faith

In the quiet northwestern wall corner of St. Mary's church, a mosaic reveals itself only to those who stand at the Marian altar, gazing westward. A tapestry of our parish's journey.

Bishop Nykyta Budka the first Ukrainian Catholic bishop of Canada blesses the First Immigrants: Their faces emerged from the mosaic, weathered by ocean crossings and dreams of a new land. A priest with his arms crossed receives the blessing. The Basilian Monastery in Mundare, Alberta is shown

just above them: where the Basilian priests began their spiritual journey west. To the left you see the spires of the Old St. Mary's Church on Princess Street: and on the right is the current church of St Mary's. At the very top you see the emblem of the Basilian Order, the pillar of fire which led Moses and God's chosen People in the desert, represents St. Basil's firm faith and intense love of God and fellowman. In this sacred space, the mosaic speaks—a silent sermon...reminding us that faith transcends walls, that history is woven into every stone. As you look at the mosaic you see—a tapestry of love, sacrifice, and hope.

Sodality of our Lady in St Mary's Parish

The Sodality of Our Lady was first initiated by Fr Vital Pidskalny in 1956. Twelve girls expressed an interest in joining. On March 23,1956 permission was granted. On May 27,1956 twelve candidates were formally received into the Sodality. Great encouragement was given by the Ukrainian Catholic Women's League who provided the capes for the initiates. With the parish support and the efforts of Prefects: Clara Babiy, Gail Ewaskin and Marilyn Nikiforuk the sodality grew and in 1981 it celebrated its 25th Anniversary.

In the heart of St. Mary's parish, a spirited group of women came together—the Sodality of Our Lady. With unwavering support from the community and the tireless efforts of Prefects Clara Babiy, Gail Ewaskin, and Marilyn Nikiforuk, this vibrant sisterhood flourished.

The parish joyously, echoed the commitment and sisterhood that had grown over the years as the Sodality marked its 25th anniversary. The celebration was nothing short of spectacular.

A Few Years Later... around 1983, the Sodality's chapter came to a close. The memories lingered like incense in the sanctuary. The blue capes, once worn with pride, now hang in a wardrobe closet next to the UCWL room in the basement of St. Mary's. They still whisper stories of unity, purpose, and shared laughter... when the Sodality gathered for retreats, heartfelt conversations, the warmth of friendship and faith, communion breakfasts, wedding showers, The Sodality adorned brides-to-be with lace, laughter, and well wishes. Wrapped gifts, shared marriage advice (some practical, some poetic), and celebrated love's promise. The church echoed with joy as they showered blessings upon the newlyweds.

Though the **Sodality of Our Lady** official chapter closed; the quiet prayers, the candlelit vigils, the shared hymns and memories transcends time. Their devotion to St. Mary's remains unwavering, like the stained-glass windows of St Mary' that catch the morning sun.
