

Fifth Sunday of Great Lent

In the Byzantine tradition, this Sunday is particularly significant as it is dedicated to St. Mary of Egypt, a model of radical repentance and humility. Her life is a powerful reflection of the call that Jesus makes in this Gospel - to embrace the way of the Cross, to serve rather than to be served, and to humble oneself in order to be exalted in God's eyes. Like St. Mary of Egypt we are called to acknowledge our sins and rely completely on God's mercy; we are called to embrace humility.

The Church places her commemoration on this Sunday to prepare our hearts for Holy Week. Just as she was blocked from entering the church due to her sins, we are reminded that we too must purify our hearts before we enter into the mysteries of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

Her life echoes the Gospel message:

"Whoever wants to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be the slave of all." (Mark 10:43-44)

St. Mary was born in Egypt in the 4th century. At a young age, she left her home and moved to Alexandria, where she lived a life of extreme immorality and self-indulgence. She admitted that she did not do this out of poverty, but out of uncontrolled passion and desire. She lived as a harlot for seventeen years, often seducing men simply for the pleasure of sin rather than for financial gain.

One day, she joined a group of pilgrims traveling to Jerusalem for the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Her motive, however, was not piety but the opportunity to indulge in more sin. Yet, when she arrived at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, something miraculous happened.

St. Mary humbled herself completely, serving only Christ, and was exalted in His Kingdom. She is a beacon of hope for all sinners and an example of how deep repentance can lead to divine grace and holiness.

Prayer of St. Ephrem (Prayed during the period of Great Lent)

O Lord and Master of my life, give me not the spirit of sloth, indifference, lust of power, and idle chatter. (*Prostration*)

Instead, grant to me, Your servant, the spirit of temperance, humility, patience and love. (*Prostration*)

Yes, Lord and King! Grant me the grace to see my faults and not to condemn my brother; for You are blessed for ever and ever. Amen. (*Prostration*)
